Report on the audit of UNDP Myanmar Community Development for Remote Townships (Project No. 63580) Executive Summary

The UNDP Office of Audit and Investigations (OAI), from 30 October to 26 November 2013, through ECOVIS STT Vietnam Co., Ltd (the audit firm), conducted an audit of "Community Development for Remote Townships" (Project No. 63580) (the Project), which is directly implemented and managed by the UNDP Country Office in Myanmar (the Office). The last audit of the Project was conducted by OAI in 2012.

The audit firm conducted a financial audit to express an opinion on whether the financial statements present fairly, in all material aspects, the Project's operations. The audit covered the Project's Statement of Expenditure (Combined Delivery Report) for the period from 1 January to 31 December 2012 and Statement of Assets and Statement of Cash Position as of 31 December 2012.

The audit was conducted under the general supervision of OAI in conformance with the *International Standards* for the Professional Practice of Internal Auditing.

Audit results

Based on the audit report and corresponding management letter submitted by the audit firm, the results are summarized in the table below:

Key recommendations: Total = **7**, high priority = **1**

For high (critical) priority recommendations, prompt action is required to ensure that UNDP is not exposed to high risks. Failure to take action could result in major negative consequences for UNDP. All high (critical) priority recommendations are presented below:

Project management (Issue 1)

<u>Verification of Funds Utilization Statement</u>. There were discrepancies between reported figures and actual balances on unliquidated commitments. Some purchase orders were paid, however, they were not acknowledged as receipted in Atlas. As a result, the balance of unliquidated commitments as at 31 December 2012 was overstated by \$26,400. This did not result in a qualification of the financial statements as it represented only 0.4 percent of project expenditure which was below the auditors materiality level.

The Project also recorded a motor vehicle in the Atlas system twice, and as a result, the amount of un-depreciated fixed assets shown in the Funds Utilization Statement as at 31 December 2012 was overstated by \$37,364.

Recommendation: The Office should periodically (on a quarterly or semi-annual

basis) verify the commitment balances appearing in the Funds Utilization Statement and institute an independent tracking system for such balances to identify and address possible misstatements.

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I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. Background

The Community Development for Remote Townships (CDRT) Project is a continuation, consolidation, improvement and expansion of activities initiated under the earlier phases of the Human Development Initiative Programme (HDI) of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) in Myanmar. The project implementation was started on 21 January 2003.

In 2012, the project was operating in 1,451 villages in 26 townships in five states; Kachin, Chin, Rakhin, Mon and Kayin States covering a total population of 788,684 or 140,003 households.

2. Purpose of this report

ECOVIS STT has been contracted by Office of Audit and Investigation (OAI) to conduct the financial audit of the Project "Community Development for Remote Townships" in Myanmar with Project Award No. 00051177 and Project No. 00063580 ("the Project") covering the period of 1 January 2012 to 31 December 2012. The audit field work was conducted from 30 October 2013 to 26 November 2013.

3. Objective

The objective of the financial audit was to express an opinion on project's financial statements and particularly to express an opinion on whether the Combined Delivery Report ("the CDR") presents fairly the expenditures incurred by the project for the period from 1 January 2012 to 31 December 2012 and funds utilization status as at 31 December 2012 in accordance with UNDP accounting policies and that the expenditures incurred were:

- (i) in conformity with the approved project budgets;
- (ii) for the approved purposes of the project;
- (iii) in compliance with the relevant regulations and rules, policies and procedures of UNDP; and
- (iv) supported by properly approved vouchers and other supporting documents.

The audit also covered the review of the Project's Statement of Assets and Equipment and expressed an opinion on whether the Statement of Assets and Equipment presents fairly the balance of assets of the project as at 31 December 2012.

4. Scope of Audit

The scope of the audit relates only to transactions concluded and recorded against the Project over a given period.

Specifically, the audit covered the following:

- (i) The expenses incurred and recorded in the CDR of the project during the period from 1 January 2012 to 31 December 2012 and the Funds Utilization Statement as at 31 December 2012 as reported by the UNDP Myanmar Country Office; and
- (ii) The value and existence of the assets and equipment held by the project as at 31 December 2012.

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5. Methodology

A risk based approach was applied in performing the audit.

6. Results of financial audit

Audit opinion on the Combined Delivery Report and Funds Utilization Statement

We expressed an unqualified audit opinion on the Combined Delivery Report for the period from 1 January 2012 to 31 December 2012 and an unqualified audit opinion on Funds Utilization Statement as at 31 December 2012.

Audit opinion on the Statement of Assets and Equipment

We expressed an unqualified audit opinion on the Statement of Assets and Equipment valued at USD278,387.66 as at 31 December 2012.

7. Key findings and recommendations

There are 7 audit findings of which 1 are assessed as High priority and 6 as Medium priority.

The High Priority audit finding was the undue verification of Funds Utilization Statement which led to discrepancies between reported figures and actual status of balances on Funds Utilization Statement as at 31 December 2012.

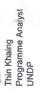

These notes form an integral part of, and should be read in conjunction with, the accompanying financial statements.

1. PROJECT BACKGROUND

The Community Development for Remote Townships (CDRT) Project, MYA/01/002, under HDI-IV is a continuation, consolidation, improvement and expansion of activities initiated under the earlier phases of the Human Development Initiative Programme (HDI) of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) in Myanmar. The project document for HDI-IV was signed on 13 December 2002 and implementation was started on 21 January 2003. Initially, the project operated in 13 townships in the Border States. In 2005, the project expanded into 13 new townships in different Border States.

In 2010, a one year extension of the HDI (including CDRT) till end of 2011 was approved by the UNDP Executive Board and agreed by the Government. In the light of the preparation of a new three year UNDP program, UNDP in September 2011 proposed to the Executive Board to extend the HDI (including CDRT project activities) for another year till the end of 2012, which was eventually approved by the Executive Board in September 2011 and agreed by the Government.

In 2012, the project was operating in 1,451 villages in 26 townships in five states; Kachin, Chin, Rakhine, Mon and Kayin States covering a total population of 788,684 or 140,003 households.

The development objective of Project is to strengthen the capacity of poor communities in selected remote border townships to address their basic needs through a participatory and transparent community development approach.

The immediate objective of Project is to cultivate and strengthen the capacity of village institutions and community based organizations and households in project villages to plan and undertake development activities that address their basic social and food security needs in a participatory, sustainable and transparent manner.

The Project has the following outcomes:

- Village community institutions able to prepare and implement more effective village development activities in a participatory and equitable manner;
- Village communities able to take care of their and their families' basic social needs (health and education) as a result of increased skills and knowledge and access to social infrastructure and service: and
- Village communities with improved income and food security as a result of increased skills, knowledge and access to sustainable livelihood service and assets.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted by the UNDP Myanmar Country Office in the preparation of these financial statements.

Basis of financial statements preparation

The financial statements, expressed in United States Dollars ("USD"), have been prepared in accordance with the International Public Sector Accounting Standards ("IPSAS").

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with IPSAS, which is an accrual basis of accounting.

Prior to 1 January 2012, UNDP Myanmar Country Office prepared the project's financial statements in accordance with the United Nations system accounting standards (UNSAS), which prescribed the use of a modified accrual basis of accounting.

Fiscal year

The fiscal year of the Project is from 1 January to 31 December.

Use of estimates

Preparing financial statements in accordance with IPSAS requires the UNDP Myanmar Country Office to make estimates, judgements and assumptions in the selection and application of accounting policies and in the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and expenses. For this reason, actual results may differ from those estimates. Accounting estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis, and revisions to estimates are recognized in the year in which the estimates are revised and in any future year affected. Significant estimates and assumptions that may result in material adjustments in future years include selection of useful lives and the depreciation/amortization method for property, plant and equipment/intangible assets; impairment on assets.

Foreign currency transactions

Transactions arising in currencies other than USD during the year have been translated into USD at the exchange rates set by the UNDP for the month of the transactions. Any exchange differences arising from these transactions are dealt with in the UNDP Country Office accounts.

Property, plant and equipment

The threshold for recognition of property, plant and equipment as an asset is USD500 or more per unit, and for leasehold improvements it is USD50,000 ("qualified assets").

UNDP Myanmar Country Office has capitalized all projects' qualified assets acquired as at 1 January 2012 and thereafter. Project assets acquired pre-2012 controlled by UNDP Myanmar Country Office were capitalized and a memorandum listings is maintained by for control and management purposes.

All qualified property, plant and equipment since 2012 are stated at historical cost, less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. This includes costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition of the asset and the initial estimate of dismantling and site restoration costs. Where an asset is acquired for nil or nominal consideration, the fair value at the date of acquisition is deemed to be its cost.

UNDP Myanmar Country Office elected to apply the cost model to measurement after recognition instead of the revaluation model. Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or are recognized as a separate asset only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to UNDP and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. Repairs and maintenance are charged to surplus or deficit in the statement of expenditures in the year in which they are incurred.

Depreciation of property, plant and equipment is calculated using the straight-line basis over the estimated useful lives, except for land, which is not subject to depreciation. When parts of an item of property, plant and equipment have different useful lives, they are accounted for as separate items, i.e., major components of property, plant and equipment. Assets under construction are not depreciated, as they are not yet available for use.

The estimated useful lives are as follows

VehiclesCommunication and IT equipment4 years

Given the expected pattern of usage of property, plant and equipment, there are no residual values following full depreciation. A gain or loss resulting from the disposal of property, plant and equipment arises where proceeds from disposal differ from its carrying amount. Those gains or losses are recognized in surplus or deficit in the statement of expenditures.

Impairment of non-cash generating assets

Since 2012, qualified property, plant and equipment are reviewed for impairment at each reporting date. For property, plant and equipment, the UNDP Myanmar Country Office reviews for impairment during the biannual physical verification process. An impairment loss is recognized in surplus or deficit in the statement of expenditures when the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount of an asset is the higher of an asset's fair value, less costs to sell, and its value in use. Impairment losses recognized in prior periods are assessed at each reporting date for any indications that the impairment of value has decreased or no longer exists. An impairment deficit is reversed only to the extent that the asset's carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined, net of depreciation or amortization, if no impairment deficit had been recognized.

Expense recognition

Expenses are recognized when goods/services are delivered/rendered and accepted by UNDP Myanmar Country Office.

Advances transferred to executing entities/implementing partners are recognized as expenses when goods are delivered or services rendered by the executing entities/ implementing partners and confirmed by receipt by UNDP Myanmar Country Office of certified expense reports as applicable, i.e., financial reports, Funding Authorization and Certificate of Expenditures forms or project delivery reports. Once those expense reports are received, UNDP Myanmar Country Office recognizes expenses in its statement of expenditures. Data may be obtained from the audited statements of executing entities/implementing partners or, when such statements are not available at the reporting year end, from the entities' statements as submitted for audit/unaudited statements.

Commitments

Commitments are future expenses and liabilities to be incurred on contracts entered into at the reporting date for which UNDP Myanmar Country Office has minimal discretion, if any, to avoid in the ordinary course of operations. Commitments relating to employment contracts are excluded. Commitments include contracts for the supply of goods or services which UNDP Myanmar Country Office is expecting to be delivered in the ordinary course of operations.

3. SERVICES CONTRACT - INDIVIDUALS

This represented salary for service contract holder in area/township office.

Findings and Recommendations - Audit for the period from 1 January 2012 to 31 December 2012

Besides the purpose of our audit of the Combined Delivery Report ("CDR") of the Project for the period from 1 January 2012 to 31 December 2012, and accompanying Statement of Funds Utilization, Statement of Assets and Equipment as at 31 December 2012 which was to enable us to form an opinion in accordance with International Standards on Auditing as to these statements for the period from 1 January 2012 to 31 December 2012, we also performed additional procedures in accordance with the terms of reference for the 2012 audit, which require us to access compliance with UNDP regulations, rules, policies and procedures. Our review was conducted in the areas of organization and staffing, project management, human resources management, financial and cash management, procurement, asset management, information systems and general administration.

Following the completion of the audit and the examination of the Project's management, we set out in the attached report certain matters. We have used the following system to categorize these matters by priority:

High (critical) Action that is considered imperative to ensure that UNDP is not exposed to high risks. Failure to take action could result in major consequences and issues.

Medium (Important)

Action that is considered necessary to avoid exposure to significant risks.

Failure to take action could result in significant consequences.

Low

Action that is considered desirable and should result in enhanced control or better value for money. Low priority recommendations, if any, are dealt with by the Auditors directly with the Office management, during the exit meeting and through a separate memo subsequent to the fieldwork. Therefore, low priority recommendations are not included in the audit report.

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Furthermore, our findings were also classified by possible causes as follows:

- Lack of/or inadequate policies/procedures/guidelines;
- Lack of/or inadequate guidance/supervision at the project level;
- Inadequate guidance/monitoring at UNDP country office level;
- Lack of/or insufficient resources (specify: financial, human or, technical resources);
- Inadequate planning;
- Inadequate training;
- Human error;
- Intentional overriding of internal controls; and
- Inadequate management structure.

One finding might be associated with more than one cause; however the main cause has been indicated.

The report has been shared with UNDP Myanmar Country Office for their comments and further inputs (if any). These comments have been reflected in the relevant sections and under each observation.

We would like to take this opportunity to record our appreciation of the assistance and cooperation of the Project and UNDP Myanmar staff throughout the course of our work.

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A. Organisation and Staffing

No significant findings noted during the year.

B. Project Management

1. Verification of Funds Utilization Statement

Priority

High

Observation

During the audit, we noted some discrepancies between reported figures and actual status of balances on Funds Utilization Statement. Details were as follows:

- Commitments balance shown in Funds Utilization Statement as at 31 December 2012 was US\$53,612.75. Based on verification, the commitment balance was misstated by errors of queries in the ATLAS systems. The way commitment is captured in the system is purchase order ("PO") less any un-vouchered receipts as it was assumed that all POs, except travel POs, will have receipts. However in 2012, which is the start of IPSAS year, there were some POs opened with receipt not required option. Thus there is no receipt for the PO and consequently although the payment has been made, the commitment did not get reduced due to lack of associated receipt. As the result, commitments balance in the Funds Utilization Statement as at 31 December 2012 was overstated by USD26,400.
- The project double recorded in the ATLAS system a motor vehicle with cost of US\$38,000. This asset was depreciated by US\$636 during 2012. As consequence, an amount of un-depreciated fixed assets shown in Funds Utilization Statement as at 31 December 2012 was overstated by US\$37,364; and

We noted that the Project management did not verify the nature and accuracy or maintain any independent tracking of such balances as at 31 December 2012.

Risk

Without proper verification of balances on Funds Utilization Statement, the Project might not ensure completeness and mathematical accuracy of such balances and have in-place adjustments to correct for error resulting from misstatements.

Recommendation

The Project should perform periodically a verification of balances on Funds Utilization Statement (i.e. on quarterly or semi-annually basis) and institute an independent tracking system for such balances to ensure significant misstatements are adequately corrected.

Management comments and Action Plan

Management agrees that fixed asset and commitment as reported in the fund utilization page of the CDR are overstated.

Action: Management team took note of Auditors' recommendation to perform periodic verification on items reported under funds utilization page.

2. Improve quality of Monitoring & Evaluation ("M&E") activities

Priority

Medium

Observation

The Terms of Reference (TOR) of Sectoral Specialist for the Monitoring and Evaluation Unit provided that the M&E team should spend approximately 40% of their time (approximately 100 days) to travel to project areas. We noted that the M&E team proposed M&E Plan and carried out M&E activities for year 2012 with 7 field visits with total time of 38 working days.

As per our review of M&E reports, only findings and recommendations were presented. No revisit plan and/or follow-up actions were scheduled.

Risk

Without adequate coverage, quality of M&E activities might not be ensured. Limited time and townships might lead to difficulties in identifying systematic weaknesses as well as number of factual findings. Without a revisit plan, implementations might not be properly followed-up.

Recommendation

Plan of field visits should be properly prepared and implemented to adequately monitor and evaluate progress of the Project, including identification of action plan and follow-up where necessary.

Management comments and Action Plan

Monitoring trips to the field were done by not only the M & E staff but also conducted by other UNDP staff on different occasions: RR/RC/HC, CD, ARRs, Programme Officers as well as Project Managers and National Project Coordinators as and when needed.

Apart from that, M & E team under HDI was not only the staff who are designated as M & E Specialist and M & E Associate, project managers at different levels (Area, Township) and even Community Development Facilitators also participated in monitoring project activities. The project M & E system and plan is based on participatory approach as we directly implemented project activities by our own staff, therefore monitoring was carried out in different phases of monitoring for planning and designing, implementation and process monitoring. Therefore, the frequency of field visit and the total days spent in the field were more than you mentioned once you considered the all concerned UNDP staff field visits for M & E purpose.

Another significant factor during 2012 was that the field level implementation were completed by end of September 2012 and we started to implement the transition programme activities resulting in the actual implementation period of HDI during 2012 was shorter than normal previous years and consequently it become shorter period for field monitoring by M & E Specialist and Associates. Therefore, the proposed field visit period in terms of % of time and # of days were not fully achieved as proposed.

Action:

Since the project has been closed, the Management team took note of the audit observation and will ensure M&E activities under the new project.

C. Human Resources

3. Management of human resources documents

Priority

Medium

Observation

During the audit, we noted that profiles of Service Contract ("SC") holders were partially maintained in both country office and township offices. Based on the testing conducted, 8 profiles in 45 selected SC holders were missing at the country office and there were no copies maintained at township offices because the CDRT project was already closed.

Risk

Partially maintaining profiles of SC holders might lead to difficulties in management of such SCs, especially for monitoring and custody purposes. Current status of SC staffs might not be adequately updated.

Recommendation

Human resources Unit should maintain a consolidated and accurate structural database of staff profiles within the country office to township offices. All staff profiles should be maintained in both forms of softcopies and hardcopies and the softcopies should be periodically backed up for completeness of the database.

Management comments and Action Plan

The HR unit always ensure all required documents are obtained in recruitment process. The reason for missing documents is that the office was under renovation and therefore filing cabinets were moved from one place to the other one, which resulted in misplacement of HR files.

Action: HR unit will ensure that all documents are maintained in soft and hard copies for all recruitments in the future.

4. Absence of compulsory forms in recruitment process

Priority

Medium

Observation

During 2012, there were 7 recruitments under Service Contracts (SC) carried out in some townships of the project. Through performing compliance tests for 5 recruitments (Service Contracts) at Bilin, Matupi, Waingmaw and Hpa-an townships during the year, we noted that 4 Minutes of the Service Contract Review Committee's Meeting for 4 successful recruitments at the Bilin (recruited posts is Senior Community Development Facilitator and Community Development Facilitator), Waingmaw (recruited post is Security Guard) and Hpa-an townships (recruited post is Community Development Facilitator) are not available for our reviews.

Moreover, the DEX Service Request Form was neither prepared with justifications for replacement/new recruitment nor submitted to Project Manager and DEX Human Resource Unit for approval (4/5 reviewed recruitments lacked Request for DEX Service Centre Support Services).

Risk

The absence of obligated supporting documents indicates weaknesses in filing and monitoring documents at the Human Resource Unit in Yangon office. Besides, without the DEX Service Request Form and SC Review Committee's Meeting Minutes, it might raise questions to third parties about the correctness as well as compliance of such recruitments.

Recommendation

The Project should ensure that all relevant recruitment documents are filed in Recruitment's files in a locked location that is only accessible to Human Resource staff.

The DEX Service Request Forms should be prepared and approved by Project Manager and DEX HRU for all replacement/new recruitments at the townships as well as Yangon office.

Management comments and Action Plan

The HR unit always ensure all required documents are obtained in recruitment process. The reason for missing documents is that the office was under renovation and therefore filing cabinets were moved from one place to the other one, which resulted in misplacement of HR files.

Action:

HR will make sure that filing system is in place, both soft and hard copies for easy reference in the future.

D. Finance and Cash Management

5. Accounting policies

Priority

Medium

Observation

Prior to 1 January 2012, UNDP prepared its financial statements in accordance with the United Nations system accounting standards (UNSAS), which prescribed the use of a modified accrual basis of accounting. For the period from 1 January 2012 to 31 December 2012 and onwards, UNDP is required to prepare financial statements in accordance with International Public Sector Accounting Standards (IPSAS) which is an accrual basis of accounting. The adoption of IPSAS is mandatory for Headquarters and Country Offices. However during the audit, we noted that the project has not yet adopted new accounting policies in the following aspects:

- There were some expenses recorded in 2013 when payments were made, however, the related services were provided/completed in 2012. As the result, expenditures in 2012 were understated by USD19,440.
- There were some prepayments for leased building expenses recorded as expenditures incurred in year. As the result, the expenditures were overstated by USD29,618.

Risk

Without adopting new accounting policies which are in accordance with IPSAS, the Project has not complied with UNDP accounting policies, which in turn resulted in misstatements in its Combined Delivery Report for the period from 1 January 2012 to 31 December 2012.

Recommendation

The Project should adopt IPSAS immediately to present fairly the Combined Delivery Report.

The Project is closed at date of our review. However, we would like to raise this matter for implementing new country programme.

Management comments and Action Plan

Payment requests for those POs were received by Finance unit only in January 2013 although the services were received in 2012. The importance of timely receipting was re-communicated and Requesting units are aware of the need to enter receipt to reflect expenditure in the period in which goods/services were received.

Starting 2012, in accordance with IPSAS, un-depreciated assets, un-used inventory, commitment, and prepayment are reported separately which in the past have been reported as expense in the CDR. All UNDP offices adopted IPSAS since 1 January 2012.

Action: Management agrees with auditors' recommendation and will use prepayment modality for future lease payments to be fully IPSAS compliant.

6. Signatures on the list of participants

Priority

Medium

Based on the audit sample for expenditure line – Training, workshop & conference, we noted that:

- Some participants signed on attendance lists acknowledging their receipt of allowance on behalf of others without attached note/explanation; and
- Some lists of participants lacked signature of the receivers.

Risk

Failure to require each participant to sign on list of beneficiaries may make it difficult to prove that allowance payments have been made to genuine participants recorded in the list of participants.

Recommendation

The Project Management should ensure that all payments to those in the attendance lists are acknowledged by the participants themselves.

Management comments and Action Plan

We have monitoring tools to check whether the beneficiaries actually received or not. In these cases, we found that all the training participants have already received actual amounts of allowance but they could not sign on paper due to low level of literacy and requested another beneficiary to sign on their behalf.

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Action:

Management team noted the audit observation and recommendation and will share this concern to all staff under the new project for future compliance with financial rules when processing payment.

No significant findings noted during the year.

F. Assets management

7. Overall management of assets and equipment

Priority

Medium

Observation

Many assets used by the Project were tagged under the name of other Projects such as DGCU, HH. These assets had been used by the previous Projects and after they had closed, these assets were managed and used for CDRT Project. However, their tags were not amended and updated under the name of CDRT Project.

Risk

The assets used for the Project were tagged under the name of other Projects and might result in difficulties in overall management of assets by the Project. It could be possible that these assets were misused for other purposes rather than the Project's activities.

Recommendation

The Project should replace the old tags of assets transferred to CDRT from other Projects with tags under name of the Project for management purpose.

Management comments and Action Plan

We take note of the auditor's recommendation and will replace the old tags of assets transferred from CDRT to other projects with the new tag under new project.

No significant findings noted during the year.

H. General Administration

No significant findings noted during the year.

I. Follow- up findings of previous audit

There were 8 audit findings raised for the period from 1 January 2011 to 31 December 2011. Six of those were fully implemented. One audit finding about the lack of Project board was not implemented. However, we did not re-raise as it was not applicable with project status. One remaining audit finding about was that Field visits were not undertaken by M&E Sectoral Specialists. This matter was partially implemented and hence, re-raised in this year's management letter in point B.2.
