**Executive Summary**

The UNDP Office of Audit and Investigations (OAI), through PKF Littlejohn LLP (the audit firm), from 23 May to 8 June 2022, conducted an audit of ‘Enhancement of commercialization services of Gran Mercado de Belen – Iquitos, Phase II’ (Project No. 122786, Output No. 118265) (the Project), which is nationally implemented with support services provided by the UNDP Country Office in Peru. This was the first audit of the Project.

The audit firm conducted a financial audit in accordance with the International Standards of Auditing (ISA), the 700 series, to express an opinion on whether the financial statements present fairly, in all material aspects, the Project’s operations. The audit covered the Project’s Combined Delivery Report, which includes expenses for the period from 1 January to 31 December 2021 and the accompanying Funds Utilization statement<sup>1</sup> as of 31 December 2021. The audit did not include activities or expenses processed and approved in locations outside of the country (such as UNDP Regional Centres and UNDP Headquarters) or expenses of other United Nations agencies. The audit did not cover the Statement of Assets as no assets were held by the Project. In addition, the audit did not cover the Statement of Cash Position as no separate bank account was established and maintained for the Project.

The audit was conducted under the general supervision of OAI in conformance with the *International Standards for the Professional Practice of Internal Auditing*.

Based on the audit report submitted by the audit firm, the results are summarized in the table below:

## Report on the Audit of UNDP Peru

### Project Name - ENHANCEMENT OF COMMERCIALIZATION SERVICES OF GRAN MERCADO DE BELEN – IQUITOS, PHASE II

(Project ID 122786, Output ID 118265)

The UNDP Office of Audit and Investigations (OAI), through PKF Littlejohn (the audit firm) conducted an audit of project “Enhancement of commercialization services of Gran Mercado de Belen – Iquitos, Phase II” (Project ID 122786, Output ID 118265) (the Project), which is nationally implemented<sup>1</sup> with support services provided by UNDP Peru (the Country Office). The duration of the audit was from 23 May to 8 June 2022.

The audit firm conducted a financial audit to express an opinion on whether the financial statements present fairly, in all material aspects, the Project’s operations. The audit covered the Project’s Combined Delivered Report, which includes expenses for the period from 1 January to 31 December 2021 and the accompanying Funds Utilization statements<sup>2</sup> as at 31 December 2021.

The audit did not include activities and expenses incurred or undertaken at the “responsible party” level or expenses processed and approved in locations outside of the country (such as UNDP Regional Centres and UNDP Headquarters) or expenses of other United Nations. In addition, the audit did not cover the Statement of Cash Position as no separate bank account was established and maintained for the Project.

The audit was conducted under the general supervision of OAI in conformance with the International Standards for the Professional Practice of Internal Auditing.

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

PKF Littlejohn conducted the financial audit of UNDP NIM Project ID 122786, "Enhancement of commercialization services of Gran Mercado de Belen – Iquitos, Phase II"- Output no. 118265 implemented by UNDP Peru following the CO Support to NIM Modality for the period from 1 January to 31 December 2021. The audit was undertaken on behalf of the Office of Audit and Investigations (OAI) United Nations Development Programme (UNDP). The audit was carried out from 23 May to 8 June 2022.

### Audit opinions

We have issued audit opinions as summarized in the table below and as detailed in the next section:

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## THE AUDIT ENGAGEMENT

### Audit Objectives and Scope

The objective of the financial audit was to express an opinion on the NIM project's financial position which includes:

- Expressing an opinion on whether the financial expenses incurred by the project between 1 January to 31 December 2021 as well as the Funds Utilization statement as at 31 December 2021 and the accounts receivable and accounts payable as at 31 December 2021 are fairly presented in accordance with UNDP accounting policies and that the expenses incurred were: (i) in conformity with the approved project budgets; (ii) for the approved purposes of the project; (iii) in compliance with the relevant regulations and rules, policies and procedures of UNDP; and (iv) supported by properly approved vouchers and other supporting documents.
- Expressing an opinion on whether the Statement of Fixed Assets, at net book value, presents fairly the balance of depreciated assets of the project as at 31 December 2021. This statement must include all assets available as at 31 December 2021 and not only those purchased in a given period. Where a project does not have any assets or equipment, it is not necessary to express such an opinion.
- Expressing an opinion on whether the Statement of Cash held by the project presents fairly the cash and bank balance of the project as at 31 December 2021. Disbursements made against a project are usually financed from regular country office bank accounts. Exceptionally, a dedicated account may be opened and used solely for the cash transactions of a project, e.g. if the project is in a remote location. The audit firm is required to express an opinion on the Statement of Cash only where a dedicated bank account for the project has been established. In cases where the cash transactions of the audited project are made through the country office bank accounts this type of opinion is not required.
- As maybe applicable, provide the progress made in implementing the recommendations raised in previous year audit report.

The Financial Audit was conducted in accordance with the International Standards on Auditing (ISA), the 700 series.

The scope of the audit relates only to transactions concluded and recorded against the UNDP project between 1 January to 31 December 2021. The scope of the audit did not include:

- Activities and expenses incurred or undertaken at the level of “responsible parties”, unless the inclusion of these expenses is specifically required in the request for proposal, and
- Expenses processed and approved in locations outside the country such as UNDP Regional Centres and UNDP Headquarters and where the supporting documentation is not retained at the level of the UNDP country office.

The project CDR recorded an amount of USD 57,822.30 as commitments as at 31 December 2021, which is broken down as follows:

- An amount of USD 16,494.28 corresponded to the contract of two external consultants whose payment remained pending as services were not fully rendered in 2021; as a result, this commitment was recorded as such as at 31 December 2021 and recognized as a project expense in the first semester of 2022;
- An amount of USD 12,796.28 corresponded to the contract of two external consultants for which the services were provided but at the time of the audit had not been invoiced. According to the explanations received the service provider will provide the invoice in the coming months and then will be recognized as a project expense in 2022; and,
- An amount of USD 28,531.76 corresponded to 14 purchase orders which were canceled in 2022.

## **INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT ON STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL POSITION**

We have audited the financial position of the UNDP project ID 122786, “Enhancement of commercialization services of Gran Mercado de Belen – Iquitos, Phase II” output ID 118265 titled ‘Mejoramiento Mercado Belen II’, for the period 1 January to 31 December 2021 which includes: (a) the accompanying Combined Delivery Report (CDR); (b) the Funds Utilization statement (“the statement”); and (c) the project-related accounts receivable and accounts payable.

The CDR expenditure totalling USD 674,331.89 is comprised of expenditure directly incurred by the UNDP Country Office in Peru for an amount of USD 502,148.97 and expenditure incurred by entities other than the Country Office for an amount of USD 172,182.92. Our audit only covered the expenditure directly incurred by the UNDP Country Office in Peru of USD 502,148.97.

### **Unmodified opinion**

In our opinion, the attached CDRs and Funds Utilization statement present fairly, in all material respects, the expenses of USD 502,148.97 directly incurred by Country Office in Peru and charged to the project for the period 1 January to 31 December 2021 in accordance with UNDP accounting policies and were: (i) in conformity with the approved project budgets; (ii) for the approved purposes of the project; (iii) in compliance with the relevant regulations and rules, policies and procedures of UNDP; and (iv) supported by properly approved vouchers and other supporting documents.

### **Basis for unmodified opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs). Our responsibilities under those provisions and standards are further described in the ‘Auditor’s responsibilities’ for the audit of the CDR and funds utilization section of our report. We are independent of UNDP in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board of Accountants’ Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (IESBA Code) and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with this code. We have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with this code. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

### **Management responsibilities**

Management is responsible for the preparation of the CDR and the Funds Utilization statement of the project, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of a CDR and funds utilization statement that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

## Auditor's responsibilities

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the CDR and the Funds Utilization statement are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with ISAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these documents.

As part of an audit in accordance with ISAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the CDR and the Funds Utilization statement, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the organization's internal control.
